About the survey

Total N=15,200 registered voters (Margin of Error [MOE] = +/- 0.8%)

- > Representative samples: Latino, African American, AAPI, American Indian, and White voters
- Black over samples: FL, GA, MI, NC, NV, OH, PA, TX, WI (for each of these states, n = 400)
- > Black sample: n = 4,100
- MOE is +/-1.5 (Blacks in total sample) and +/- 4.9% (Blacks in state samples)

Field Dates: October 23 - November 2, 2020

- Screen already voted, certain voted
- > Blended sample, % online,% live telephone interviews
- Language according to respondent preference: English, Spanish, Chinese Mandarin, Chinese Cantonese, Korean, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Hmong
